We are READERS!!

We have entered the exciting part of reading—BLENDING!! We have also read our first story <u>Sal</u>, a couple of week ago. From now on, if you haven't already, you should be keeping the Superkid books. Each one will contain a story that your child can read over and over. This is a great way to practice blending and to building your child's confidence in his/ her reading abilities! Each child will also bring home a list of our Superkids words to use to practice reading and blending. On these lists there will also be Memory Words (words that cannot be

sounded out and must be memorized). 5 mintues of practice each day will really help your child become more fluent in reading!Along

with reading, we are working hard at writing words

correctly. We are learning that the letters in words like to be close together, but words need spaces between them. Please encourage your child to do this when doing any writing assign-

ments on the weekly homework. Practice makes perfect! Also, encourage your child to sound out the words as much as possible. I know this can be a real challenge for some children, especially at the beginning, but the more they try on their own, the more confident and independent they will become!

Perfect spelling is not expected—I want the children to try to hear as many sounds as possible, and not worry so much if it "correct." Your hard work now will pay off in the long run!!

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Shapes and Number, numbers and shapes!

We will be finishing our 3D shapes chapter within in the next week,

and then will move on to comparing numbers. In our shapes chapters, we have learned these plane (or flat) shapes: circle, square, triangle, rec-

tangle and

hexagon. We have also learned these solid shapes: sphere (ball), cube (box), cylinder (can) and cone. Sometime this month, we will have

an All-Class Show and Tell with solid shapes. The Show and Tell

slip will look very similar to our regular one, but will have a note explaining the Show and Tell on the front. As always, Show and Tell *must* be brought on Friday—if your child forgets to bring it, it

cannot be brought on a different day.

We will return to working with numbers in our next chapter, when we work on comparing numbers.

This means we will be using the words: more, less, greatest, least. You can help your child gain a more concrete grasp of these terms by asking them questions as home about things in our house or when you are out and about-do you have more _____ or _? What do you have or ? less of: Sometimes these can be difficults concepts to grasp, so any help you can give your child at home will be very beneficial!!
